Frank Capatch, LCSW, is a veteran clinical social worker who began his career in human services in 1975. He formerly worked as Clinical Faculty for Edinboro University's online MSW Program, University of Pennsylvania; Past Director/faculty of Social Work, D'Youville College, Buffalo, New York; currently a field instructor for the Social Work Program at the University of Hawaii, Manoa; currently manages a group of professionals in private practice on the island of Hawaii; and is Program Director for the Green Will Conservancy, which has been hosting trauma training workshops for clinicians on the Big Island of Hawaii. Mr. Capatch has a wide range of clinical and organizational experience and is a Certified Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) therapist. He has organized and facilitated the provision of EMDR Psychotherapy, resiliency and trauma-based training for Big Island clinicians in conjunction with senior faculty of the EMDR Institute. He is in training for consultation and facilitation of others in the practice of EMDR. He provides a wide range of community training in the subject of trauma as a specialty. As a community-based educator, he is able to discuss and compare various treatment modalities in relationship to traumatic processes.
